### **Forensic DNA phenotyping, the prediction of human physical appearance from DNA**

Susan Walsh, PhD, Assistant Professor of Biology at IUPUI, will discuss new research in the emerging field of appearance prediction. Walsh and her team are exploring how intelligent information on physical appearance can be gleaned through the analysis of DNA—left behind, for example, at a crime scene.

The Forensic Science Lecture Series (FSLs), sponsored jointly by the Indiana Medical History Museum and the University of Indianapolis Archeology & Forensics Laboratory, was established in 2004 to help educate the public in the forensic sciences and related fields and to spotlight the fascinating stories that scientists have to tell.
